** CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Shorter Catechism Questions

Q. 92. *What is a sacrament?*

A. **A sacrament is an holy ordinance instituted by Christ; wherein, by sensible signs, Christ, and the benefits of the new covenant, are represented, sealed, and applied to believers.**

Q. 93. *Which are the sacraments of the New Testament?*

A. **The sacraments of the New Testament are baptism and the Lord's supper.**

Q. 94. *What is baptism?*

A. **Baptism is a sacrament, wherein the washing with water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, does signify and seal our ingrafting into Christ, and partaking of the benefits of the covenant of grace, and our engagement to be the Lord's.**

Q. 95. *To whom is baptism to be administered?*

A. **Baptism is not to be administered to any that are out of the visible church, till they profess their faith in Christ, and obedience to him; but the infants of such as are members of the visible church are to be baptized.**

This Week's Mission Focus: Across the Country

SAPC Youth Mission Journey

Michael Wadhams, Lummi Nation, Native American Ministry

The Lummi Reservation is located on the Puget Sound near the Canadian border. It is estimated there are 6,590 people living on the reservation, with roughly 2,564 of these being enrolled tribal members.

The Lummi People are very traditional. They have been isolated from Christianity because they fear that it will take away their way of life. For many years, Mission to the World (MTW) missionaries have been working directly with the Lummi People, assimilating into the tribe's culture to show them that through Christ, they do not lose their culture, they gain new life. The doors are open to share the gospel, and there are now two missionary families on site.

In July 1998, Michael Wadhams and family moved from Cape Town, South Africa, to the U.S. to work with Native Americans. They settled in North Carolina where they entered a full-time pulpit ministry on the Cherokee Indian reservation. Later moving to Charlotte, NC, where for over 11 years they were involved in pastoral ministry. After completing a master's degree, Michael began pursuing an MTW opportunity to serve the Lummi Nation in Washington State. Today the Wadhams reside in Lynden, WA, which is nestled between the Nooksack and Lummi reservations. They labor among the tribes through developing relations, evangelism, and mentoring/discipleship. The long-term goal is to establish Native churches in the region.

Pray for the SAPC Youth Leadership Team as they meet with Michael Wadhams on January 28 to plan a Youth Mission Journey to the Lummi Nation in July 2018.


