Volunteers of all ages and in all stages of their careers and retirement can use their gifts and skills to further God's Kingdom by serving a diversity of ministry needs. MNA SecondCareer matches PCA church plants, churches, and other PCA ministries that have limited resources and need skilled help with volunteers who have the needed skills and time to contribute. Our volunteers vary in age from 20 on up through retirement. Volunteers with recreational vehicles are discovering the joys of serving with our RV Outreach. Volunteers serve online from the comfort their home or travel to be onsite. Across the US and Canada, there are Kingdom opportunities waiting for volunteers who have a heart to spread the gospel.

*One volunteer effort having a major impact is church members loaning their places at the beach or mountains to church planters and struggling new church pastors. Often new pastors invest 70 and 80 hours a week, month after month, year after year. They drop their vacation time with family to save funds and miss quality family time. Unfortunately, neglecting family results in marriage problems and the church struggles. We want volunteers who will loan their places to these pastors' families. The testimonies of these pastors are enough to bring tears. We really need several folks to volunteer their places as an investment in church planting.*
