This Week's Mission Focus: Across the World

Germany: Munich

Sam & Lizzie Goodwin, Steffi Strack-Karaüzüm

Sam & Lizzie Goodwin serve with Mission to the World (MTW) as church planters in Munich, Germany. They are long-time SAPC members and were sent out by SAPC in November 2012. This year (August 2017-August 2018), they are in the States on Home Ministry Assignment (HMA), visiting their many churches and supporters and raising the additional support needed to return to their ministry and calling.

"When we return to Munich in August, Sam will continue to serve Gospel Church München. His language fluency continues to improve, and he will be teaching and discipling more. Lizzie will be focusing more on teaching, translation and discipleship."

Pray for wisdom in counseling couples in this church ministry: wisdom to stay calm and follow the Lord's calling for the new challenges and opportunities that await them after being away for a year.

Pray for their daughters—Sophie, Katie and Molly—as they leave American friends and family to return to Germany. This year's frequent travel has been tough on them, but they have shown remarkable resilience to serve with their parents.

Pray that their additional support needs will be funded.

Steffi Strack-Karaüzüm (pronounced "Shteffi") is a friend of the Goodwin family. Steffi has been in Lizzie's Bible Study in Munich from its beginning and has become indispensable to Sam especially, as she proofs and corrects all his German translations. In addition to helping the Goodwins in ministry, Steffi is also taking counseling courses through Westminster/the Christian Counseling and Education Foundation (CCEF). She is visiting South Carolina for one week. Please **welcome** Steffi and **pray** for her as she serves the Gospel Church München and for safety as she travels.
