School Time Bible Ministries

Reaching Students and their Families with the Life-Changing Word of God

In partnership with parents, public schools, churches, and ministry partners, School Time Bible Ministries (STBM) provides off-campus, biblical teaching for public school students. School Time Bible Ministries provides students the opportunity to embrace the gospel, to grow in Christian maturity, and to apply biblical principles in the many choices they must face in their lives.

STBM began in Gary, Indiana, in 1914. Since then classes have grown and flourished in public school schedules for over 100 years. The concept was brought to South Carolina in 1996 and currently over 10,000 students from more than 100 public schools participate. Lexington Richland School District Five offers the program at CrossRoads Intermediate School. STBM equips local churches to provide the program and SAPC is the off-campus site.

Students are taught biblical truths through the curriculum *God's Plan for Redemption*, tracing what God is doing throughout Scripture from Genesis to Revelation. 49 sixth grade students completed the course last year; 10 made a first-time commitment to Jesus.

You can help this fall, between August 22 and October 25:

Volunteer:

- ☞ Teacher: Teach class according to the STBM curriculum; all supplies provided.
- ☞ Classroom Aide: Set-up class room, (sharpen pencils, put out Bibles and other supplies), help students find Bible passages, general support of the teacher.
- ☞ Safety Team: meet the students at the school and walk them safely to and from their classrooms in the SAPC Youth Area.
- ☞ Nursery/Childcare: Free other volunteers to serve by caring for their children.
