Robin Price

Robin was raised in Mobile, Alabama and has a degree from Vanderbilt University. She worked in Christian ministries to children and youth. She has a passion for studying and teaching the Bible. After serving three years as a short-term missionary with Covenant of Grace Church in Odessa, Robin returned and is now serving as a career missionary.

Her ministry involves leading women's Bible studies, co-leading an English club outreach, mentoring women one-on-one, and helping coordinate English and children's camps. The Odessa team is working to build up the church plant, helping it to reach a level of independence and to gain respect in a region where suspicions abound.

Robin reports on the English Camp which ended recently:
Praise God for working in amazing ways at English camp!

Camp itself was a "worthy adventure" as we had conversations about Jesus, the Bible, and Christian life. Each day included English classes, Bible discussions, a Bible lesson, and a personal testimony to the marvelous things God has done in Christ. We shared the gospel each day in many settings, answering tough questions from our students. We had fun free time activities such as games, crafts, photography, and music, which all served as enjoyable ways to bond us with the students.

On the Sunday after camp, we had seven or eight students from camp visit our worship service. We had the service outside to accommodate more people (Thanks to St. Andrews Presbyterian Church in Columbia, South Carolina, for the purchase of new canopies that allow us to extend our services outside.)

Pray:

- For the Spirit's guidance in following up through events and one-on-one conversations. May He give us words to say and His love in our hearts.
- Our plans as our Odessa team will host five MTW interns from Lviv, Ukraine, for a long weekend (July 12-15).
- That the Lord will lead me in my role as Europe Prayer Coordinator.
