This Week’s Mission Focus: Across the Street

Snack Pack Ministry with CrossRoads Intermediate School (CRIS)

We have all seen statistics of hunger in our world and in our country, but let us not forget that there are hungry people—especially children—right here in Irmo. We believe that no child should be hungry. Jesus said we are to love and care for our children and SAPC is striving to do that through the Snack Pack Ministry at CrossRoads Intermediate School.

The Snack Pack Ministry is about feeding the children of CrossRoads at risk of going hungry on weekends and longer school breaks. CRIS personnel identify eligible children and coordinate the number of Snack Packs needed. Currently, 40-60 Snack Packs are filled each week by a group of SAPC volunteers coordinated by Betsy Bryant. Children take home food-filled backpacks on Fridays for the weekend, providing them with food they can count on until school begins the following week.

Specific food items are requested to fill each pack:

- **Fruit Snacks** - **Nut Bars** - **Rice Krispies Treats**
- **Cracker Packs** - **Juice Boxes** - **Kellogg’s 30-pack Cereal**
- **Mac & Cheese** - **Slim Jims** - **Mixed Fruit/Diced Peaches**
- **Applesauce** - **Instant Grits** - **Ramen Noodles**
- **Instant Lunch** - **Instant Oatmeal** - **15 oz. Cans of Pasta**

SAPC members help by bringing in food items and placing them in the designated containers in Sunday School classrooms or in the office lobby. Lists of food items needed may be found around the church where brochures and flyers are displayed.


